In term 4, we will be continuing to consolidate knowledge of Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, using lots of practical activities to develop confidence using these skills. Our learners will continue to use their knowledge of the four processes each week to continue building their confidence when problem problems including solving, multi-steps. We will also be focusing on our Maths Basic Facts and quick recall of number facts. In Mathematics, our focus will be Money and Time, and exploring different aspects of these. We will link into 'real life' problems so as it is relevant to the learners.
